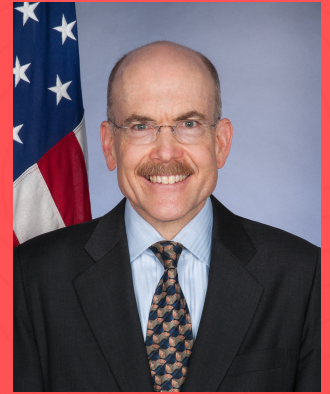

## Goodwill and the Alliance: U.S.-Japan Cooperation during and after March 11th

On March 11, 2011, a 9.0-magnitude earthquake struck Japan off the coast of Tohoku. It was followed by a devastating tsunami and triggered the meltdown of two nuclear reactors in Fukushima. Ambassador James P. Zumwalt, the Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo at the time, will discuss his role and the U.S. government's response following the disaster, the importance of the U.S.-Japan alliance to American interests, and the future of U.S.-Japan cooperation.
