## **Report on Approaches to DPRK Provocation Calls for Greater Trilateral Planning**

*Panel of Former Military and Government Officials Discuss Results at Sasakawa USA Event*

**Washington, D.C.** – On Thursday, December 6, Sasakawa USA will host a panel discussion and release a report on its recent unclassified tabletop exercise designed to test the policy, diplomatic, and military responses of the U.S., Japan, and South Korea to North Korean sanction evasion activities and signs of internal instability. The report, *Testing the U.S.-Japan and U.S.-ROK Security Alliances: Tabletop Exercise Pacific Trident II*, details the exercise and its findings. Participants on the panel discussion will include:
